

Out on the Shelves campaign fortnight is a chance for libraries to promote and build their rainbow collections, celebrate these stories and help connect rainbow young people with their stories





The Chosen One archetype is a trope used in writing where a single character is in charge of saving the world or society they live in. Whether by a seer, some higher power or force, or simply because of their bloodline, characters are chosen for some great destiny that often includes a fight between the forces of good and evil.



Works within the 'Chosen One' trope can be really fun - there are reasons series like Harry Potter and Percy Jackson are so popular! However, the Chosen One protagonist can often seem unbelievable if they are presented as the 'perfect person' or the most powerful. Sometimes it's nice to see everyday characters who *choose* their own path, rather than have destiny thrust upon them. Katniss from the Hunger Games is an interesting example. Does she choose her own destiny by volunteering for the reaping? Or is she a traditional 'Chosen One'? What do you think?


