




Did you know we have YA graphic novels in our libraries? Graphic novels are great if you're short on time but still want to read a rich story!












Book of the month ...

What's a trope?

A trope is a plot device or character trait that is used so commonly in a genre (romance, fantasy, dystopian etc) that it's seen as commonplace or conventional! For example, the 'chosen one' who is destined to save the world in fantasy, or the many 'love triangles' that feature in romance novels.



Many tropes can be overused in YA fiction - but that doesn't mean we can't love them! Cliches are cliche for a reason - it means we, as readers, like to read them.
