# COCITORIO NEWS FROM WAITAKI DISTRICT COUNCIL OCTOBER 2021

October is a month packed full of creative ideas to entertain you and keep the kids busy these spring school holidays.

For us at Council, it's been 'water, water everywhere and quite a lot to think' about lately as we drill down into what the Government's 3 Waters reforms mean for Waitaki. We're also thinking about how we can design a plan for how Oamaru Weston and Kakanui will develop into the future. Read more about it!



What's the 3 Waters reform about?

After the Havelock North water contamination event where four people died, the Government is implementing new standards for drinking and wastewater in NZ.

Proposed changes to the way the country's 3 Waters (drinking water, wastewater and stormwater) services are delivered to the community will affect councils and private water suppliers across the country.

Currently the 67 councils in NZ look after drinking water, wastewater and stormwater in their areas. Waitaki has 15 water supplies connected to 12,000 properties and 8 wastewater areas servicing over 8000 properties. Government is proposing that control is removed from individual councils and transferred to 4 main entities. Water services in Waitaki would be controlled by Entity D which covers most of the South Island, servicing the needs of around 900,000 people. The Government's proposals are very complicated so we have made a series of videos to inform people in Waitaki about what these changes might mean for us, should the reforms go ahead. Council will not be making any decisions on these proposals until the public have all the information, and we have sought your feedback.



We'll soon be asking for your feedback on the draft Spatial Plan for Oamaru, Weston and Kakanui which will directly affect this plan as it goes forward.

What's a Spatial Plan? A Spatial Plan is a strategic blueprint document that sets out where and how we should grow and develop over the next 30+ years. It identifies actions for how growth should occur in an integrated and holistic way. It outlines a vision and broad set of principles, strategic directions, and actions and will visually illustrate how Ōamaru, Weston and Kakanui may develop in the future, and will help identify things like: existing and future urban areas; infrastructure needs; priority areas for investment and action; areas to protect and enhance such as heritage, cultural and natural environment; and areas subject to natural hazards.

We'll be hosting drop-in sessions at the Kakanui hall, Weston hall and in Oamaru more on this soon so watch this space.

# DUNTROON LOOS, in with the NEW!

We are planning to partially demolish the old public toilets in Duntroon, leaving only the roof, front and side walls such that the roadside artwork is preserved.

New toilets will be installed on the old pharmacy site. We've heard the community's concerns about the dangers of speeding traffic passing through Duntroon and how close vehicles come to cars parked within the shoulder so we're planning a raft of safety improvements with help from \$250K secured from Government (MBIE).
