We're HERE WHATEVER the LEVEL

We know Alert Level 3 can be complicated and present more challenges for everybody as some businesses can get back to work but with lots of rules and restrictions.

Most Council facilities will remain closed at Level 3. Parks are open but please stay off the equipment. Public toilets are closed apart from those on state highways for use by essential workers. We have started taking bookings again for building inspections but urgent LIMS are still suspended for now. Our Animal Control team are available throughout and so are our hard-working customer services team who, while our offices are closed, can still be contacted by phone on 03 433 0300 or by email at service@waitaki.govt.nz.

Returns bins at our Libraries remain closed - please keep all library items at your home until reopening. There are no overdue fines or fees during Levels 3 & 4 and renewal fees for rental items will be waived.

The Waitaki Resource Recovery Park remains closed for now, but the Ōamaru Transfer Station and Council owned rural Recovery Parks/Transfer Stations are open with some hours reduced and Covid restrictions in place.

Check out our website for full details on services affected or call us to talk to one of our friendly staff. We'll update this information should Waitaki move to Level 2.


Does CENTENNIAL PARK HIT THE MARK?
