I'm not submitting just to cavil on detail! Two things I thought I'd run by you- 1. Burnside trees are given special mention in A listing - but not listed in trees schedule: ChCh Botanic Gardens staff (and others) have said the 3 SPREADING OAKS on the winding drive to the West are a group without NZ equal 'as a specimen group' to their knowledge- looking at other listings in Trees I suggest Burnside has that additional character/distinction to warrant its Trees listing?</p>

	<p>2. 15 Wansbeck (cnr with Tees) our 'new' home was built 1920-Grenfell architect. Prior to 1920 a 2 storey Shop/Residence stood neat to the corner in line with the Oamaru Stone wall that now surrounds us. ...probably an 1860's addition to the Terraces over the road. We have some significant indicators of the first building fabric being incorporated into the 1920 residence: I'd like you to see the interior foundation stone wall, plus the stones Alan Ward took from corner and put as a sculpture feature in our rebuilt garden wall. It seems that the Grenfell history is ripe for recognition before this generation passes- now 100 years past!!! Jill Grenfell may be known to you. Also some good photos from Peter Garvan are helpful evidence. Best for the continuing hard labour, Bruce</p>
