DECISION - ON PAPERS

This is an application by the North Otago Tennis Association for a Special Licence in respect of premises situated at 39A Chelmer Street Oamaru 9400 known as "North Otago Tennis Pavillion".

Reports have been received from The Waitaki District Council Licensing Inspector, The New Zealand Police and The Medical Officer of Health.

Based on the information provided to us on the complete file, we have determined to grant the application on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act. We grant the applicant a special licence pursuant to s.22 of the Act.

The licence is approved and will be subject to the following conditions:

Section 147 (3) - Compulsory conditions

Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the following (a)

Sunday 15th October 2023 (1.00pm to 6.00pm)

Saturday 21st October 2023 (1.00pm to 7.00pm

Sunday 22nd October 2023 (1.00pm to 7.00pm)

Sunday 3rd December 2023 (1.00pm to 7.00pm)

Saturday 6th January 2024 (2.00pm to 9.00pm)

Sunday 7th January 2024 (2.00pm to 9.00pm)

Sunday 4th February 2024 (1.00pm to 5.00pm)

Sunday 18th February 2024 (1.00pm to 6.00pm)

Sunday 10th March 2024 (1.00pm to 7.00pm)

Saturday 16th March 2024 (2.00pm to 9.00pm)

Sunday 17th March 2024 (2.00pm to 9.00pm)

Saturday 23rd March 2024 (2.00pm to 9.00pm)

(b) Drinking water must be freely available from the bar and water filter station on the premises.

Section 147 (1) - Discretionary conditions

a) The licence holder must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.

- b) Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times alcohol is being sold or supplied. The application has specified sandwiches, pies, savouries, pizzas, filled rolls and salads.
- c) Low-alcohol beverages (2.5%) must be available for sale and supply on the premises.
- d) Non-alcoholic beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises. Ginger beer, lemon/lime and bitters, lemonade, coca cola, juices and water are specified in the application.
- e) The licensee must provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises. The name and phone number of the local taxi companies must be clearly displayed. The organisers must be proactive in promoting non-drink driving.
- f) A copy of this licence, together with signs showing the age restriction must be clearly displayed.
- g) Alcohol must only be sold, supplied and consumed within the area marked on the plan attached with the Special Licence.
- h) The nominated manager must be available throughout the entire period of the Special Licence, to ensure the requirements of the Act in relation to the sale and supply of alcohol are observed.

The licence is also subject to the following conditions, which in the committee's opinion are not inconsistent with the Act:

- (a) Noise should be controlled so as not to disturb neighbouring residents.
- (b) This licence does not excuse the applicant from obtaining where necessary a Building Consent in respect of tents or marquees.

In terms of s.142 (g) and (i) of the Act the premises, situated at 39A Chelmer Street Oamaru 9400 are more precisely identified in a plan dated as accepted by the District Licensing Committee on **2 October 2023**.
