Mobile Shop and Itinerant Trader Guidelines for trading in the Waitaki District

YOUR PERMIT

Is valid for 12 months from date of issue. It can be renewed prior to the expiry date; however approval will be subject to your compliance with the permit conditions and guidelines and payment of the annual fee. Your permit should be prominently displayed and available to any Authorised Officer of Council who requests it. The permit is not transferable.

WHERE CAN YOU TRADE?

- On a state highway provided that, prior to commencing trading, you have obtained a 'Licence to Operate a
 Mobile Shop on a State Highway', from the New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA). This applies to all State
 Highways, except in areas where a 50km/hr vehicle speed limit applies and a properly formed footpath (or
 parking space) is available
- On a privately owned property provided that, prior to commencing trading, you have obtained permission from the landowner and ensured no resource consent is required
- On Council owned or operated parks sporting grounds or campgrounds; any Council owned land or
 property; or any Council Road reserve or road corridor provided that, prior to commencing trading, you have
 obtained permission from the Council's Recreation Team, Property Team or Roading Team.
- In the area east and south of Tyne Street between Itchen Street, Arun Street and Waterfront Road, Oamaru, including Harbour Street and the Victorian Precinct (refer to map) provided that, prior to commencing trading, you have obtained a Licence to Occupy from the Council's Property Team.

YOU CANNOT TRADE:

- On any road (that is not a State Highway) where the vehicle speed limit is over 50km/hr
- Within 300 metres of a permanent business selling a similar product *
- Within 50 metres of any intersection or pedestrian crossing *
- From any pay & display, time restricted, electric vehicle charging point, accessible parking space or Council
 owned or operated car park
- or a distance specified in the Licence to Occupy

YOUR VEHICLE

- LPG cylinders must be stored securely outside the mobile shop and when the mobile shop is unattended at any time while in a public place, the cylinders shall be secured against tampering
- Your vehicle must have current registration, Warrant of Fitness, certification, and insurance cover

GENERAL

- You must remove all litter generated by the activities of your trading
- The Council, as required, may include in permits or guidelines any restrictions or conditions including (but not limited to) trading areas, types of goods for sale, hours of operation. The Council will provide seven days' notice of any change to restrictions or conditions
