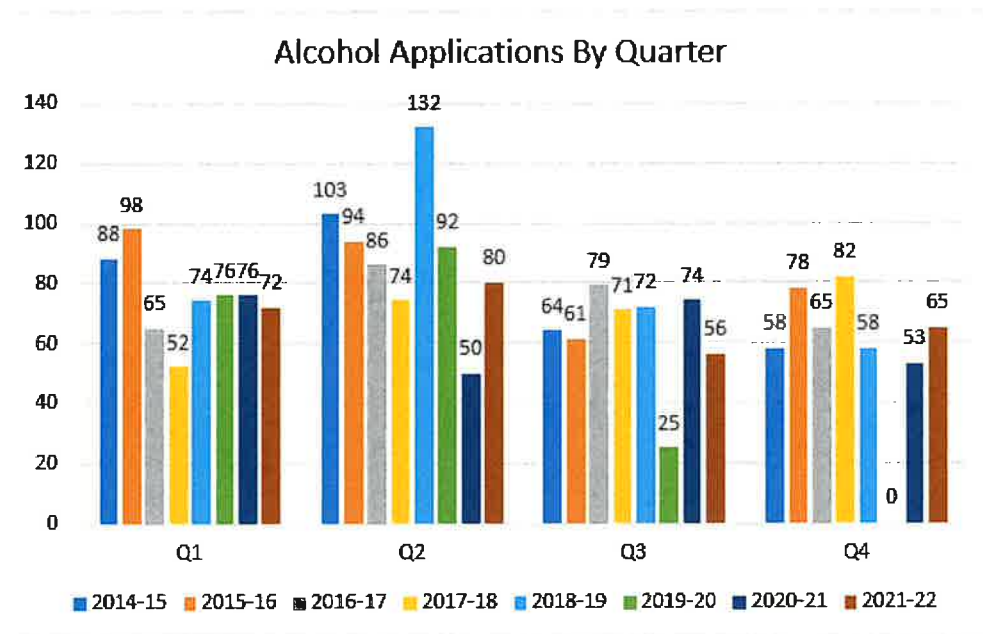

The Committee has not developed or adopted any new initiatives in 2021-2022. When dealing with decisions on the Papers, the Chair has ensured there is clearly evident adherence to the standards required of applicants, particularly in relation to disclosure of all relevant criminal convictions. This has followed incidents in which parties have failed to disclose convictions. In one case, this generated a Hearing which incurred costs that may have been avoided had disclosure occurred. Ensuring applicants clearly and verifiably adhere to the stipulated disclosure obligations is a safeguard for the Committee and the wider community.

11. Please comment on the manner in which Covid-19 has impacted on DLC operations.

The impact of Covid-19 on DLC operations is probably best described as inconvenience. From time to time, to comply with the rules associated with various precautionary levels, meetings have either been postponed or conducted with members participating remotely. Other processes have been similarly affected, with documents needing non-contact collection and delivery. The Council's Licensing Inspector has not reported to the DLC any problems associated with performing the role as a result of Covid-19.

12. Please comment on the ways in which you believe the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 is, or is not, achieving its object. Note: the object of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 is that:

- a) *the sale, supply, and consumption of alcohol should be undertaken safely and responsibly; and*
- b) *the harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimised.*

Determining whether the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act is or is not achieving its objective will almost certainly depend on the wider subjective perspective of the person answering the question. Those who hoped and still hope the Act would make efforts to contain or even reduce the number of outlets, both on and off licences, are likely to be disappointed, because that does not appear to have happened. Certainly, there has been a slight increase in local off-licence operators.

That said, there has only been one breach of sale rules resulting in a stand-down period being imposed (some years ago) and very few concerns raised by the police and the Public Health agency regarding the operation of licensed premises. The Police have objected to two applicants seeking to be granted or renew their Manager's Licence. This could indicate that the Act has introduced new standards and imposed new tests to which operators have generally responded in a positive and responsible manner. Operators generally, including societies and clubs, are more aware of their obligations and more careful to ensure they are met. The Act has been pivotal in this awareness-raising.

The Act may also have influenced the closure of the most problematic venue in the district. It shut down not long after the Act came into force, and no-one has attempted to run a similar business from the original or other venue at any time since. This too may indicate that the Act is having an inhibiting effect and therefore achieving its object.

National statistics also show that younger people are drinking less than their age group has in the past. In fact, their behaviour is generally more conservative across the board. This may signal wider societal changes but, again, it could show that the Act, with its stricter controls and enforcement, is achieving its object.

A perverse outcome is that the Act may, unintentionally, be encouraging 'pre-loading.' Because the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 and other legislation has imposed new standards and higher costs on licensed premises, the cost of drinking at hotels and bars has increased markedly. As a result, anecdotal evidence, and actual incidents this committee is aware of, show that many people are buying cheaper off-licence alcohol and consuming considerable quantities before going to venues in order to manage their costs. It is hard to see how amendments to the Act could change this but acknowledging the problem may be the first step in identifying means by which it may be avoided, remedied, or mitigated.

Other impacts include what is happening on our roads. Here it would appear that vehicle accidents caused by drug use now exceed those caused by alcohol. Lower blood alcohol limits and stricter policing must be contributing factors here along with the Act's influence on public opinion. That said, the number of fatalities on our roads is going up after a period of consistent decline, which may be a sign that the cadre of alcohol and drug users and abusers has become complacent and no longer fears detection as they did previously. Equally, local experience (and Hearings) would indicate that the Act has not enacted or enabled price control measures to impact and possibly constrain supermarket sales. When off-licence holders advise that their supermarket rivals are *selling* alcohol at lower prices than they can purchase it *wholesale*, that would seem to be an actual or potential problem in terms of the Act achieving its object.

14. What changes or trends in licensing have you seen since the Act came into force?

Another trend noticeable here is the impact the Alps 2 Ocean cycleway is having. Running from Aoraki/Mt Cook to Oamaru Harbour, it has attracted many out-of-district visitors and rejuvenated previously problematic hotels and inns. Obviously, this is not a consequence of the Act itself but is a trend that has emerged since its enactment.

Also noticeable is a general improvement in the quality of service and dining experience offered in on-licence premises. Offering good food, a varied menu and pleasant ambiance appear to be markers of success for businesses. Old style 'booze barns' are notable, either by their absence or because patronage appears to be dropping. One very successful new business sells only its own craft beers, and another is about to offer a similar unique range. This also points to a shift towards a more discerning drinking culture.

As far as off-licence sales are concerned, supermarkets seem to be growing their market share, chiefly because they consistently sell beer and wine at cheaper prices than the specialist liquor stores. That would be one of the more discernible trends. As far as specialist outlets are concerned, the market appears fairly static. Only one new business has begun operations in Oamaru since the Act came into force and while there has been rebranding of businesses elsewhere, no other market entrants. This may be a reflection of the relatively slow population growth.

In terms of marketing, one observable trend is a reduction overall in marketing. While there are still some ads on TV and radio, these do not seem to be as common as they used to be and there are fewer print ads as well. Two local off-licence chains do use mail-out fliers to promote products and specials, but these are only delivered to letterboxes monthly if that.

In summary, one trend is for on-licence businesses to improve their food and other services and become more sophisticated. Another is for marketing to be less obvious, frequent, and more restrained. And there is less material overtly or obliquely targeting young people. All told, a static market in this area, with its ageing population, is focusing more on overall experiences for a more mature clientele.

15. What changes to practices and procedures under the Act would you find beneficial?

One beneficial change to practice and procedure would be to allow greater informality in the conduct of Hearings under the Act. Resource Management Act Hearings, for example, do not require swearing in and other formalities employed in 2012 Act Hearings. For most people, appearing at such a Hearing will be a singular experience. While the procedures may be familiar and comforting to those appearing regularly, they are alien and intimidating for the lay majority. It would be good to be able to be as little more relaxed than we are at present.

Other changes relate more to achieving the object of the Act and therefore rely on parliamentary willingness to make change. It would be good to see more local flexibility available. Different parts of the country have different communities, priorities, and local economies and DLCs should have more freedom to reflect those differences in their decisions. Parliament has, for example, allowed local authorities to make their own decisions about Easter trading.

The same sort of local discretion could be available in alcohol-related matters. That used to be the case in New Zealand and could be again. One size does not necessarily fit all. It may be argued that this discretion is available now through Local Alcohol Policies, but these have proved vexed, protracted, prone to appeal and prohibitively expensive. Changes allowing local communities quicker, cheaper access to Policies reflecting their particular aspirations would be a good thing.

Another beneficial change that would help achieve the object of the Act would be a law change elsewhere creating more severe penalties for anyone causing death in an accident involving excessive alcohol or drug use. Sentences involving home detention or loss of driver's licence regularly generate community anger. If

we really want to minimise the fatal harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol, then we should maximise some of the penalties imposed for causing such harm.

A general increase in consequences for the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol would also be beneficial, not least for young people. The perception now is that such behaviour is essentially consequence free, at least in terms of penalties imposed by parliament or the courts. Once again, if we're serious about minimising harm and maximising the safe, responsible use of alcohol, we should be increasing the disincentives for not doing so.

In that context, with studies indicating that actual access to alcohol by those under the legal drinking age and bearing in mind that surveys indicate a majority in support of raising that age, it would be beneficial if parliament was willing to reflect public opinion and raise to 20 the age at which alcohol can legally be consumed. This too would reflect commitment to the object of the Act and constrain the minority of young people now binge drinking and pre-loading to an unhealthy extent
